Clark County Annual Report 2020-21

- Many of the typical activities were curtailed this year because of the COVID pandemic. Many of the clubs met via zoom, though a few did attempt in person meetings when the weather permitted outdoors.
- ➤ Leader lessons were attended via Zoom as well. Our clubs learned how to use various forms of technology and came up with different ways to connect rather than the traditional in-person meetings.
- > The Clark County Homemakers worked with the community to make facemasks for the community's Readifest back to school kick-off in August 2020, providing over 1000 child size facemasks for the public school system.
- Clark County FCS agent helped coordinate a Thanksgiving 'Drive Pie' event in November 2020. Members could drive by the Extension and have a little safe social connection while getting a sweet treat for the holidays.
- > One of the Clark County clubs continues to send Ale8's to active-duty service members from Clark County at Christmas.
- In May of 2021, the Clark County Homemakers provided a \$500 scholarship to a deserving Clark County High School senior who plans to attend Eastern Kentucky University.
- > Clark County had 3 members attend the KEHA State meeting in June 2021 in Bowling Green.
- ➤ Homemakers worked the Clark County Fair, managing home economics entries. There were over 300 entries and homemakers were excited to see some normalcy as the COVID numbers trended downward over the summer.
- > We are looking forward to lower COVID numbers and more ability to program in person to grow our membership.

- ➤ Leader lessons were available through Zoom and Fayette Extension records each one for post viewing. The fall schedule is an area hybrid model with an in person watch party and zoom presentation.
- > Joy of Giving was carried by drop off methods and gifts were delivered by volunteers.
- > Virtual big Blue Book Club and Big Blue Goals on-line participation was one of the highest in the state. Zoom cooking classes were another new offering and well attended.
- Members continue to participate in monthly outreach programs, parent resource center for young mothers, foster care children luggage program, etc. through drop off donations.
- Masks sewn and delivered: 5494
- Master Clothing Volunteers resumed in person workshops in Fall 2021 and lead 2-3 workshops per week, i.e., 30 luggage bags for foster children.
- International Program: Over 100 dresses and shorts have been sewn for national and international programs (Doctors without Borders) and a local UK Sorority, supplying dresses to African girls.
