Dues:

Dues are twenty (\$20) per year, payable on or before June 1st. Newly recognized members do not pay dues the year they are received into membership. The membership year runs from June 1st – May 31st. Checks should be made payable to the Kentucky Master Farm Homemaker Guild and sent (given) to the chapter treasurer.

Individuals who do not renew memberships are contacted for two consecutive years. If they have not paid their dues in full at the end of the two years, they are moved to the inactive membership list and do not receive mailings for the KY Guild Chapter.

Meetings:

Spring business meeting and recognition of new members – April/May in connection with the Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association Annual Meeting.

Summer business meeting and informal gathering- often in July/August but scheduled according to dates recommended by the individual(s) hosting the activity. One or more Master Farm members usually host the summer meeting at or near their home. The meeting usually ends with an auction to raise funds. This is the only money-making project in support of Guild activities.
