

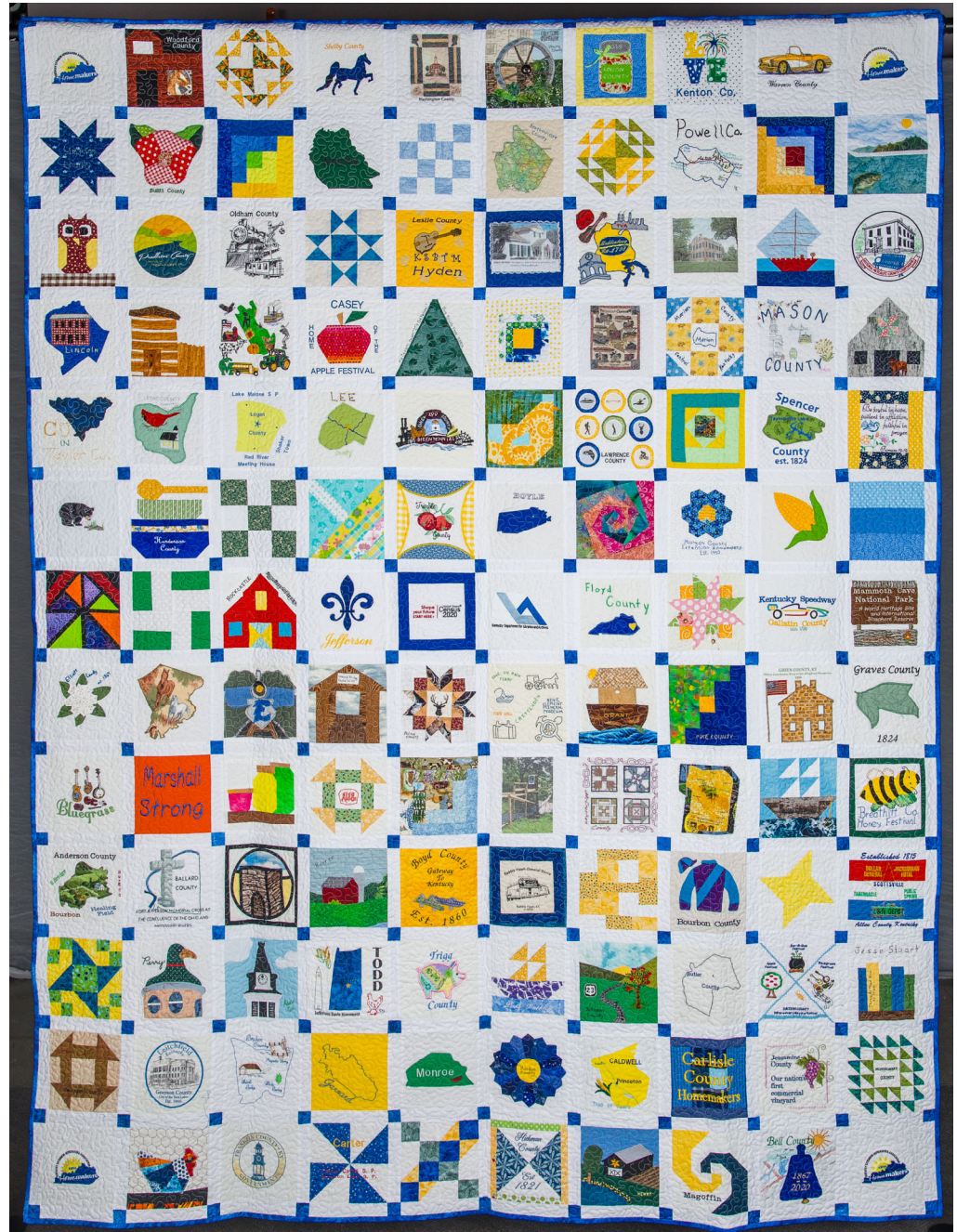
Kentucky Counts!
