MyPlate for a Healthier You – Everyone's best eating plan is not the same. Find out the number of calories and the amount of food you need to eat from each food group to keep your body healthy. Participants will learn to take a 24 hour Food Recall, a detailed summary of foods and beverages consumed in a 24 hour period. Participants will be able to compare the amount eaten from a particular food group with the amount that is recommended to make better choices to improve their diet. Food Recalls are one of the main teaching and evaluation tools for the Nutrition Education Program. Trained volunteers are needed in many communities and would count toward KEHA volunteer hours.
